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**UNI-SELECT INC. – NET EARNINGS INCREASE BY 10.8% IN THE
SECOND QUARTER OF 2007**

Boucherville, August 7, 2007 - Uni-Select Inc. reported a 10.8% increase in net earnings for the second quarter of 2007, reaching \$11,675,000 or \$0.59 per share compared to \$10,539,000 or \$0.53 per share last year. Sales reached \$313,258,000 in the second quarter of 2007, an increase of 7.6% over sales of \$291,013,000 in 2006. The increase in sales for the Company is largely due to the various acquisitions completed during the course of the last quarters and to organic growth of 1.6% which was partially offset by unfavorable US exchange rate compared to the Canadian exchange rate. Excluding the impact of the exchange rate, sales for the Company would have increased by 8.7% and earnings would have been \$0.60 per share for the quarter.

Year-to-date, sales were recorded at \$586,422,000, a \$35,767,000 increase or 6.5% compared to the same period in 2006. Net earnings reached \$17,503,000 or \$0.89 per share compared to net earnings of \$16 185 000\$ or \$0.82 per share realized during the first six months of 2006.

Sales for Automotive Group USA increased by 10.2% in the second quarter to reach \$158,814,000 compared to \$144,123,000 in the second quarter of 2006. Acquisitions completed in recent quarters contributed to an increase in sales by \$16,702,000 in the second quarter to which a growth of close to 1.0% is added. Excluding the impact of the exchange rate, sales for Automotive Group USA would have increased by 12.4%. The operating margin of Automotive Group USA remained stable at 6.6%. Year-to-date, sales were \$307,351,000, an increase of 10.4% compared to the same period in 2006. Year-to-date, the operating margin remained stable at 6.0%.

Automotive Group Canada enjoyed an increase in sales of 6.0% in the second quarter of 2007 to reach \$139,385,000 compared to \$131,531,000 during the corresponding period last year. This increase stems from the impact of acquisitions completed during the course of preceding quarters combined with organic growth of 2.0%. The operating margin of the Group improved from 8.6% in the second quarter of 2006 to 9.4% this quarter as a result of continued improvement programs on margins and costs together with the impact of recent acquisitions. Year-to-date, sales were \$250,217,000, an increase of 3.7% compared to same period in 2006. The operating margin slightly improved in the first six months of 2007 to reach 7.9% compared to 7.2% in 2006.

Sales for the Heavy Duty Group decreased by 2.0% during the quarter to reach \$15,059,000, compared to \$15,359,000 in 2006. This decrease is attributable to the transfer in 2006 of certain distribution activities to Automotive Group Canada. Excluding this transfer, the Heavy Duty Group recorded an increase in organic growth of 5.2% compared to the same period in 2006. The operating margin of the Heavy Duty Group was negative at (4.4%) in the second quarter of 2007 compared to (5.2%) last year. Year-to-date, sales were \$28,854,000, a decrease of 6.4% compared to the same period in 2006. Excluding the aforementioned transfer, the Heavy Duty Group recorded a slight increase in sales of 0.6%. The operating margin was negative at (6.3%) while it was (4.8%) in the first six months of 2006.

“Our three business segments enjoyed positive organic growth in an ever-competitive market” said Mr. Jacques Landreville, President and Chief Executive Officer of Uni-Select. “During the second half of 2007, we will continue with both our sales efforts and cost controls. We are examining various expansion projects and are confident we will conclude value-creating acquisitions in 2007. The market is hugely fragmented and opportunities are abounding. Lastly, the variation in the exchange rate between Canadian and American currencies has also affected our US income and profits which are recorded in Canadian dollars. At the current rate, foreign currencies will likely affect results for the second half of the year, the impact of which we estimate at \$0.04 per share. This impact, strictly accounting in nature, does not undermine our confidence and we are pursuing our growth in the US in keeping with our business development plan”.

Finally, the Board of Directors of Uni-Select Inc. has declared a quarterly dividend of \$0.1075 per common share payable on October 22, 2007 to shareholders of record as at September 28, 2007.

Uni-Select is Canada's second largest distributor of automotive replacement parts, equipment, tools and accessories and through Uni-Select USA, Inc.; the company also provides service to customers in the United States where it is the 8th largest distributor. Its subsidiary, Palmar Inc., sells replacement parts, tools and accessories for heavy-duty vehicles and wheels in Canada. The Uni-Select Network includes over 2,033 independent jobbers and services over 3,063 points of sale in Canada and the United States. Uni-Select is headquartered in Montreal. Uni-Select shares (UNS) are traded on the Toronto Stock Exchange (TSX).
